

12. Harder's Traditional Crafts

After more than 30 years of demonstrating and teaching weaving, Lydia decided to take her talents in a new direction. Joined by her daughter-in-law, Della, and granddaughter, Rae-Ann, Harder Traditional Crafts now represents three generations of weavers and needle workers.

The fabrics are woven from mostly natural fibers (wool and cotton) in patterns that have withstood the test of time. A variety of items from the loom as well as hand quilted and embroidered products will also be available. Demonstrations of this century old art technique of weaving will be held both days.

13. Joan's Blue Heron Gallery

Joan's interest in painting began with oils in the 1970's. She tried acrylics in 2002, painting winter scenes of landscapes, old buildings and of course, the wildlife.

She received high awards for 2005 and 2006 wildlife paintings at the Saskatchewan Wildlife Art Competition in Saskatoon.

In 2005, she was commissioned to paint three paintings for the Northern Lights Casino in Prince Albert. One is still on display after three years.

In 2008, she was invited to exhibit at the Red Roof Gallery in Athabasca, Alberta.

Les, Joan's husband, creates all the frames for her work out of oak, spruce and original barn wood. He also does commissioned matting and framing.

Sandy has taken soft tanned deer and moose hides and transformed them into decorative and useful everyday items. Picture frames, albums, clocks, dream catchers, jewelry, and much more take on a unique look as the hides are combined with a variety of beads, feathers and other natural material. Original art is also included in some of the items. If you prefer something softer, check out the hand quilted pillows.

Buck's scroll saw skill is used to transform a variety of wood into animals and scenes from nature. Buffalo, wolf, bear and elephant are a few of the subjects most popular. He also makes a variety of native inspired designs in the shape of feathers. Buck's creations come in a variety of sizes to suit anyone's décor or you could have one custom made.

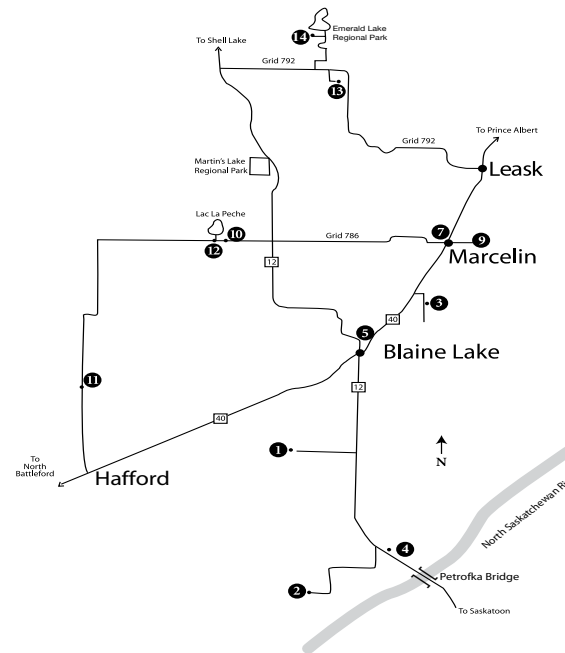

Her wall hangings, which feature hand appliqued and quilted designs in bold, vibrant colors, incorporating ancient and modern First Nation spiritual symbols, animal and bird figures and leaf designs, are available in various sizes from small 8 x 10 to larger 24 x 36 inches. Janet will take custom orders with personalized designs, or ones chosen from her collection for bed quilts, double, queen or king size. She also has a selection of men's and ladies' denim shirts that have been given a second life with patchwork quilted backs and fronts.

Located at Nikihknan Crafts at Duncan's Beach, Emerald Lake.



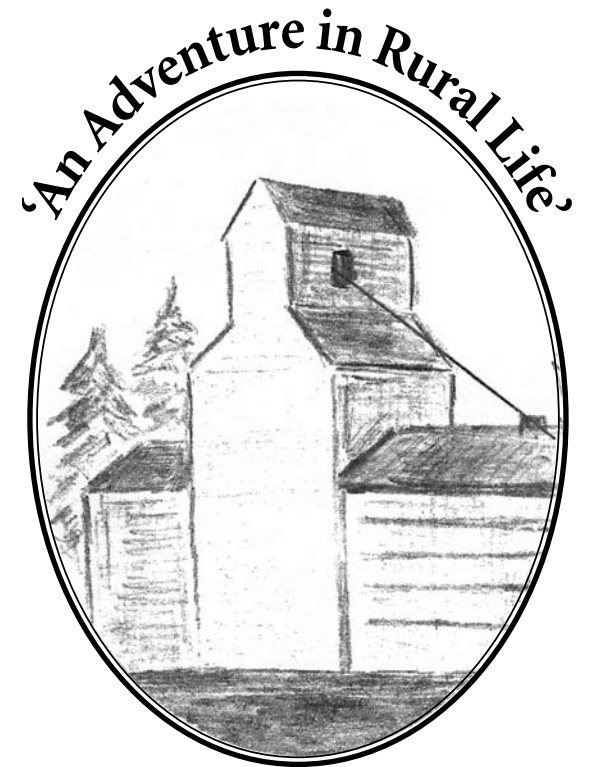

1. Heavenly Hills Orchard

2. Written in Stone

Cecil Burima (NW-32-41-7 W3) 306-497-2916

"Once you've farmed, you can do anything", is Cecil's response when asked how it is that a prairie Ukrainian cowboy is able to produce such elegant carvings from the finest stone obtainable which could be from the next field over or from Brazil.

Picking stones for 43 years on the rocky, dry prairie has provided a positive attitude and the material to start crafting.

After carving and polishing, the stone, limestone, granite, marble, or jade comes to life as the focus of your home, garden, plaza, front gate or cemetery. The fine stone craft can be tiny totem figures, translucent tableware, desktop and large sculpture, monuments and petroglyphs (roadside gate signs).

His recent artistic achievements include 'Best of Show-Sculpture 2004, 2005, & 2008', as a competitor in the Saskatoon Exhibition's 'Showcase of the Arts', his participation in the 2003 International hand stone carving competition in Junas, Provence, France, many sales and some commissions

3. Spirit of the Prairie Art and Teaching Studio

Colorful flowers, shady lawns and mosaic murals welcome visitors to this country studio. Doreen teaches and works in a variety of media. Her works range in size from miniature paintings to large-scale murals, which decorate the interior of her studio as well as the communities of Blaine Lake and Marcelin. Functional artworks

in the form of mosaic tables, painted chairs, art trays, decorative canvas floor mats as well as a variety of paintings, art cards and art prints add to the colorful display. While humor and narrative invite the viewer to enjoy the characters in her portraits, her still life and landscapes clearly establish a nostalgic mood.

Visitors are welcome to participate in a mosaic project both days. Snacks, beverages and picnic tables are available on site.

The orchard is planning to offer U-pick apples this year, weather pending, by appointment or invitation only. The concession offers fresh fruit and vegetables as available by local suppliers. Petrofka Orchard specializes in apples, dehydrated apple slices and their famous Apple Cider.
